- **Director of the Public Speaking Course (SPCC 200)**: I oversee the course content and teaching for SPCC 200, a core requirement for CSU students which services approximately 1700 students per semester. I train incoming graduate teaching assistants and supervise a teaching staff of approximately 40 instructors. I designed and administer the instructor Web page, an extensive, password-protected Website that pools resources from myself and our teaching staff, including the following: course policies, teaching tips, WebCT quiz database, an archive of class exercises, handouts, transparencies, and PowerPoint slides, and a gradebook template. I designed and update an SPCC 200 WebCT shell that instructors may clone and customize for use in their classroom. I organize a faculty mentoring program for GTAs in our department and personally monitor the classroom teaching of new instructors. I manage the administrative details of running the course, and am responsible for creating new editions of the *Speech Coursebook*, a student's handbook that accompanies the textbook. I write and help administer major exams and am available to answer student questions and concerns.
