Forum I developed during my tenure as *QJS* editor to respond to the Supreme Court’s overturning of the *Roe v. Wade* decision. I commissioned 5 essays from a diverse slate of authors to assess the rhetorical implications of the *Dobbs* decision, including those for marginalized women and all people with the capacity to become pregnant. Taylor and Francis made the forum temporarily open access for broader circulation.

Special issue of the journal I developed during my tenure as *QJS* editor to mark the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment. I commissioned 14 essays from a diverse slate of authors to offer an expanded view of women’s democratic engagement, noting especially how the dominant suffrage story erases how many BIPOC both contributed to movements for universal suffrage and were excluded from the vote well after 1920. NCA highlighted the special issue in *Communication Currents* and Taylor and Francis made the issue temporarily open access for broader circulation.
