### **Interim Department Chair** Department of Communication Studies (Fall 2021)

As Interim Department Chair, my regular duties included the following: administrative oversight and approvals; biweekly Council of Chairs meetings; compose the weekly Friday email; manage monthly faculty meetings; respond to human resources concerns and complaints about instructors, faculty, and staff; support and attend departmental events; meet regularly with staff members; meet with visiting donors and alumni; provide input on scheduling; and participate in Commencement. In addition to attending to the regular duties of the position, I completed the following special projects during the Fall 2021 semester:

- Spearheaded our department's strategic planning efforts, developing multiple iterations of a Group Map for collaborative brainstorming and voting, and designing inclusive processes that incorporated the perspectives of CCA faculty, staff, and graduate students, in addition to TTT faculty. Drafted our department's Strategic Plan document.
- Participated in the Academic Master Plan workshop and drafted our department's Academic Master Plan document.
- Wrote a [CLA Magazine article](#) that promoted faculty research efforts
- Facilitated negotiations for a faculty retention offer
- Wrote tenure and promotion letters for TTT and CCA faculty
- Served as hiring authority for the search to fill our Department Communicator position

### **Editor, *Quarterly Journal of Speech*** National Communication Association (2020-2022)

As the editor of the National Communication Association's flagship rhetoric journal, I established an editorial board, adjudicated submissions, gave publishing authors significant editorial guidance and feedback, managed the technical aspects of the publishing process, and helped to resolve conflicts as they arose during the publication process. I also conceptualized and recruited authors for one special issue and two forums. In addition to attending to the regular duties of the position, my tenure included the following innovations and accomplishments:

- Established the most diverse editorial board up to that point in the journal's 105-year history.
- Significantly increased the publication of authors from underrepresented groups and attention to subjects that historically had been marginalized in the journal. In 2018, Paula Chakravartty et al. published “#CommunicationSoWhite” in the *Journal of Communication*, reporting that from 1990-2017, 1% of the essays published in *QJS* included one or more “race-related keywords” and 3% of the first authors were individuals of color. Statistics for articles and forum contributions published under my tenure indicate that 52% of research articles and forum contributions in those issues include decolonial or anti-racist perspectives; 44% include feminist perspectives; 12% include LGBTQ+ perspectives; and 13% address international, transnational, or non-U.S. perspectives or case studies. Additionally, 32% of published authors were men, 66% were women, and 2% were nonbinary individuals. 29% of published authors were people of color and 71% were white. These percentages include all authors (not just first authors), however, because *QJS* is a humanities journal, most essays have only one or two authors. When compared to the data published in the previously mentioned article, it's clear that much progress was made under my editorial tenure.
- Published all issues on time throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Earned a 2022 Presidential Citation of Service from the National Communication Association

**Director of Graduate Studies** Department of Communication Studies (2013-2021)

As director of graduate studies, my regular duties included the following: Chair the Graduate Committee; serve on the CLA Graduate Council, which meets monthly; review 75-90 applications per year and speak personally with dozens of applicants throughout the year; coordinate recruiting, which includes working with the Graduate Program Support Coordinator to plan our annual recruiting visit and staff recruiting tables at conferences; help develop and update recruiting materials; apply for annual recruiting mini-grants; serve as temporary advisor for all MA and PhD students; consult with the chair on graduate course scheduling; keep graduate curriculum and policies up to date; evaluate student research grant proposals throughout the year; coordinate the graduate awards process; address issues and concerns related to graduate students; have regular meetings with graduate student representatives; offer mentoring for faculty new to graduate advising; supervise the Graduate Program Support Coordinator; teach the Introduction to Graduate Studies pro-seminar; coordinate graduate alumni panels; and complete a range of special projects each year. In addition to attending to the regular duties of the position, my tenure included the following innovations and accomplishments:

- Wrote the program proposal and curriculum plan for the department's PhD degree; shepherded the proposal through the university's approval process; launched the PhD degree and supervised its first four years in operation; designed all policies and procedures related to the PhD program and comprehensive exam process.
- Supported graduate students during the COVID-19 pandemic and shifted all graduate professionalization and mentoring programs to virtual delivery.
- Designed virtual graduate recruiting efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Completed assessment of the graduate program as part of the department's program assessment and strategic plan in 2020.
- Planned workshops and panels for graduate students seeking careers other than full-time teaching and employment in tenure-track faculty positions (e.g., graduate alumni panels, "Humanities at Work" workshop, etc.)

**Vice Chair of Faculty Council** Colorado State University (2011-2012)

As Vice Chair of Faculty Council, I helped manage faculty council meetings, served on the Faculty Council Executive Committee, met monthly with the university's president and provost, shaped policies, and advocated for faculty interests. Throughout my career I have been actively involved in shared governance, serving as a departmental and college representative to faculty council, chairing the Committee on Scholarship, Research, and Graduate Education, and serving as a member on the University Benefits Committee, the Faculty Council Executive Committee, and the Committee on Faculty Governance.

**Director of the Public Speaking Course** Department of Communication Studies (2000-2010)

As the Director of the Public Speaking Course, I oversaw the course content and teaching for SPCM 200, a course which serviced 50-80 sections and 1200-1800 students per semester. I trained incoming

graduate teaching assistants and supervised a teaching staff of approximately 35 instructors. I personally monitored the classroom teaching of new instructors. I managed the administrative details of running the course and was responsible for creating new editions of the *Speech Coursebook*, a student's handbook that accompanies the textbook. I wrote and helped administer major exams and was available to answer student questions, mediate grade disputes, and manage investigations of academic integrity violations. In addition to attending to the regular duties of the position, my tenure included the following innovations and accomplishments:

- Designed and implemented a graduate seminar in communication pedagogy.
- Significantly increased support and supervision of classroom teaching and conducted in-person classroom observations with each new instructor, followed by a one-on-one mentoring session.
- Significantly enhanced pedagogical resources available to public speaking instructors by designing a password-protected website that pooled resources such as FAQs and teaching tips, a quiz database, an archive of class exercises, PowerPoint slides, and a gradebook template. I also designed and updated a Blackboard course shell that instructors cloned and customized for use in their classroom.

**Director of Forensics** Colorado State University, 2000-2001

As the director of CSU's speech and debate team, I managed all team business and taught two courses that enrolled undergraduate speech team members. I supervised a coaching staff and was available to competitors for assistance and coaching. I consulted with the coaching staff on team philosophy, team policy, and the annual travel schedule. I managed the team's annual budget, prepared university travel and expenditure forms, and distributed scholarship money to competitors. I organized campus speaking events and helped plan and run our college tournament.

Taylor and Francis made the forum temporarily open access for broader circulation.

I commissioned 14 essays from a diverse slate of authors to offer an expanded view of women's democratic engagement, noting especially how the dominant suffrage story erases how many BIPOC both contributed to movements for universal suffrage and were excluded from the vote well after 1920. NCA highlighted the special issue in *Communication Currents* and Taylor and Francis made the issue temporarily open access for broader circulation.
