Internship Overview: Student interns will engage with those with diverse spiritual, religious and secular (non-religious) belief identities by educating, programming, celebrating and promoting constructive engagement across belief differences. Interns will assist with CSU partners such as The Multifaith & Belief Student Council, Student Affairs, the Office for Inclusive Excellence, ASCSU and The Center for Public Deliberation, etc., as well as off-campus partners such as local faith communities, the Fort Collins Interfaith Council, and community nonprofits with similar goals.

internship Duties:

- Expand current outreach initiatives - social media, monthly newsletter
- Event logistics and coverage - events happen from 5:30-8pm on Thursday evenings. Variety of logistical assistance including photography and write-up.
- Student spotlights - interviewing event attendees showcasing them on outreach platforms.
- Promoting on and off-campus belief-identity groups' events on campus (Ramadan, India Nite, Chai to Understand, Pagan Pride, Jewish Holocaust Awareness events, etc.)
